

How are U.N. Programs Adopted

It is useful to know how the U.N. directive programs are adopted in council meetings in order to help our councils opt-out.

According to the PCP Membership Page, municipalities can "become a PCP member in three easy steps:

- 1. Download and print the joining resoluθon and have your council adopt and sign it. The resolution clarifies the responsibiliθes and requirements of membership. Please note that it is a template, which can be modified as needed. You can download the joining resolution here.
- 2. Appoint one staff member and one elected official to be your main PCP contacts. Let them know that they are responsible for this file.
- 3. Email (or print and mail) your adopted council resolution, along with the staff member's and elected official's contact information to pcp@fcm.ca. You can also mail it to the following address:

How Councils Join

Council Resolution to Join the FCM-ICLEI Partners for Climate Protection Program

WHEREAS The Federation of Canadian Municipalities (FCM) and ICLEI–Local Governments for Sustainability (ICLEI Canada) have established the Partners for Climate Protection (PCP) program to provide a forum for municipal governments to share their knowledge and experience with other municipal governments on how to reduce GHG emissions;

WHEREAS over 350 municipal governments across Canada representing more than 65 per cent of the population have already committed to reducing corporate and community GHG emissions through the PCP program since its inception in 1994:

WHEREAS the PCP program is based on a five-milestone framework that involves completing a GHG inventory and forecast, setting a GHG reduction target, developing a local action plan, implementing the plan, and monitoring progress and reporting results;

BE IT RESOLVED that the municipality of review the guidelines on PCP Member Benefits and Responsibilities and then communicate to FCM and ICLEI Canada its participation in the PCP program and its commitment to achieving the milestones set out in the PCP five-milestone framework:

That Council approve the recommendations outlined in Report CSD16-031 dated December 5, 2016 of the Director of Community Services, as follows:

- That the revised Greater Peterborough Area Climate Change Action Plan be adopted and that the City's portion be implemented as budgets permit; and
- That the City of Peterborough's Community Sector and Corporate Sector greenhouse gas emission reduction targets of 30% and 30% respectively, and associated local action plans, be adopted and implemented as budgets permit.

Council Resolution to Leave the FCM-ICLEI Partners for Climate Protection Program

WHEREAS The Federation of Canadian Municipalities (FCM) and ICLEI–Local Governments for Sustainability (ICLEI Canada) established the Partners for Climate Protection (PCP) program in 1994; aimed at reducing or offsetting greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions to zero by 2050; by completing GHG inventories and forecasts of all corporate and community energy use and waste, setting GHG reduction targets, developing local action plans, implementing the plans, monitoring progress and reporting results.

WHEREAS The Government of Canada and the FCM accepts no responsibility for the PCP program, leaving members of council holding potential personal liability for its endorsement and implementation which then:

- quides councils' decision-making
- costs staff hours, resources and fees
- directs public funds and assets to private development goals
- · drives population growth to cities
- · targets mobility and privacy rights
- · impacts water and property rights, and
- · threatens food and energy security

WHEREAS Environmental policies must respect both scientific and economic realities. CO2 is not a pollutant and Canada's trees absorb more than double the CO2 that we emit.

WHEREAS Participation in the PCP Program is voluntary and the municipality can leave at any time.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Council of the municipality of reconsider its participation in the PCP program.
