The [Partners for Climate Protection Program](#) is a *means of implementation* providing **information for decision-making** based on Agenda 21 or UN Directives.

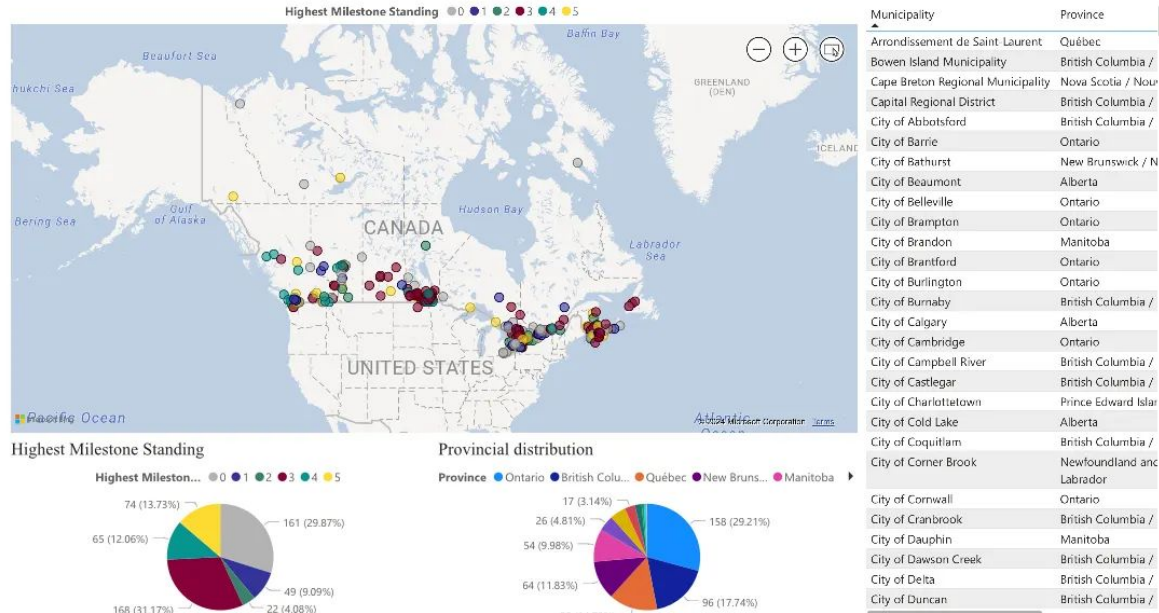

Supporting Rationale for Consideration

It is well established that climate change is increasing the frequency of extreme weather events and posing other risks, such as drought, forest fires and rising sea levels, which present serious threats to our natural environment, our health, our jobs and our economy.

The 2016 Paris Agreement, signed by more than 190 countries, including Canada, committed to limit the global temperature increase to below two degrees Celsius and to pursue efforts to limit this increase to 1.5 degrees Celsius, in order to avoid the most severe climate change impacts.

Local governments are essential to the successful implementation of the Paris Agreement.

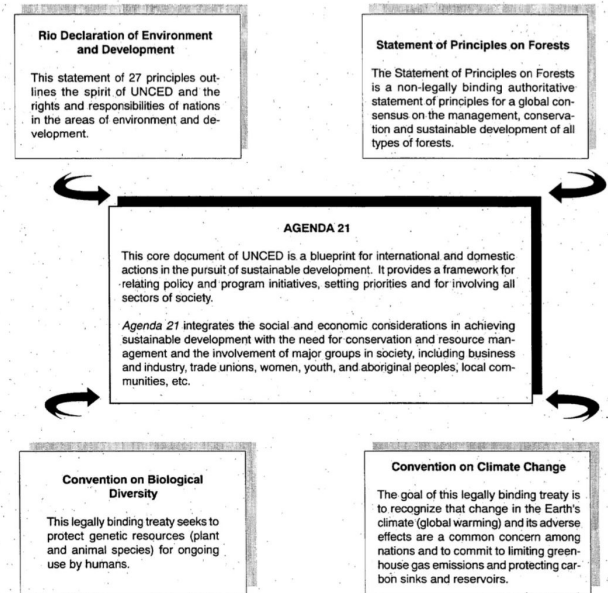

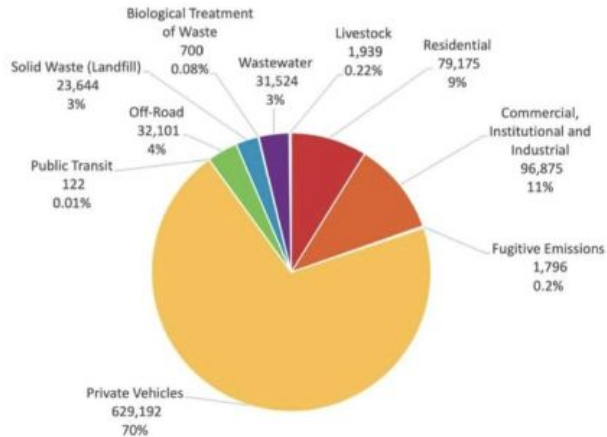

AND WHEREAS it is necessary not only to reduce carbon emissions, but also to increase community resiliency in the face of climate change, and that these approaches can offer multiple benefits including improved health and air quality, increased innovation, economic development and reduced costs in the long run;

AND WHEREAS the District declared a Climate Emergency on October 19, 2020 to clarify the District's commitment to protecting Muskoka's economy, community, and ecosystems from the impacts of our changing climate;

AND WHEREAS the District has identified Our Environment as a Priority Area with related key objectives related to climate change in its 2023-2026 Strategic Plan;

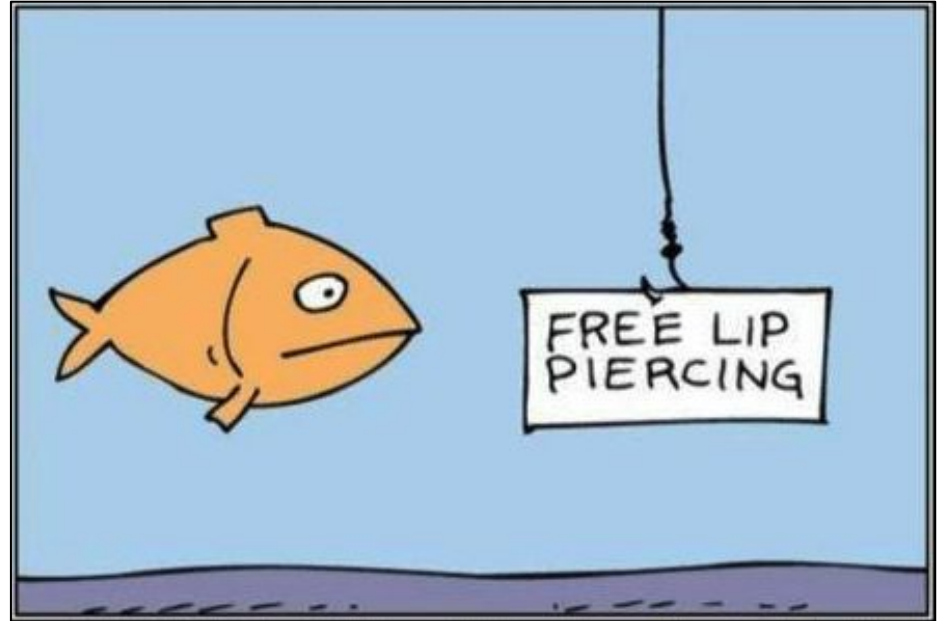
NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Muskoka Community Energy and Emissions Reduction Plan (CEERP) (Appendix A to report CPS-4-2024-1), **be endorsed**;

AND THAT the District reaffirm its commitment to reducing corporate and community greenhouse gas emissions (GHGs) by 50% by 2030 and to be net-zero by 2050.

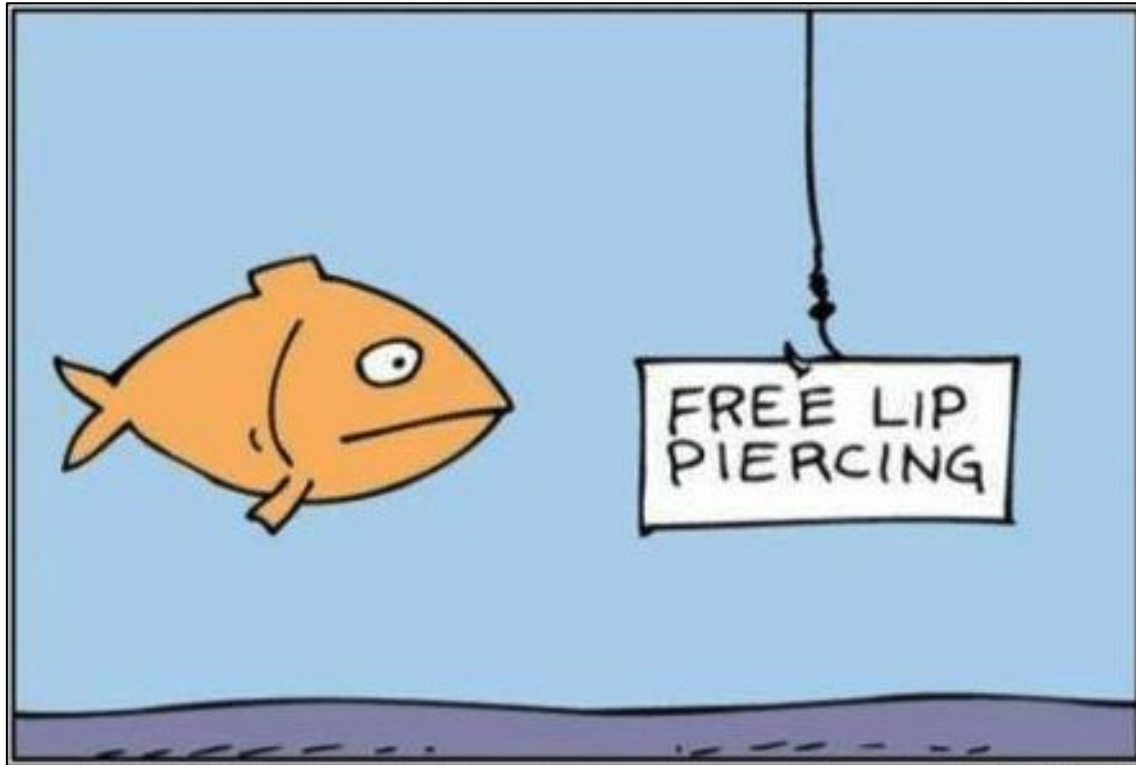
AND THAT the District **lead and convene** an annual CEERP planning and reporting workshop to bring together local organizations working on

Is Sustainable Development Compatible with the Canadian Way of Life?

Sustainable development policies, if not carefully crafted, could infringe on the Canadian way of life, affecting aspects such as private car ownership, individual travel choices, property ownership, single-family homes, and small-town growth and privately-owned farms.

What is Sustainable Development?

The term 'sustainable development' was coined by the Brundtland Commission and it apparently aims to target property rights and steer future population growth towards certain settlement areas.

Reduced tax revenue for smaller municipalities

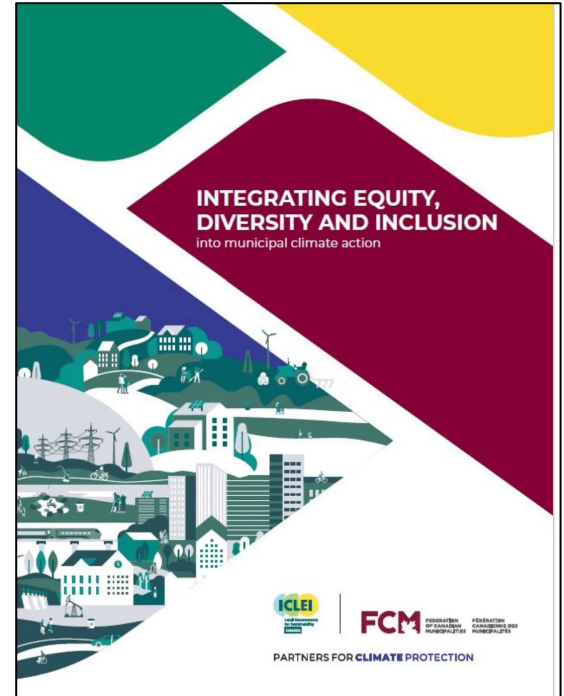

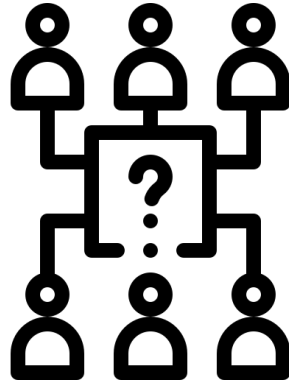
Adopting PCP Compliant Plans binds the Council and Municipality to UN Directives

Councils decision-making options will be limited to UN Directives.

- Costing Council, committee and staff time and wages
- Councils to endorse SDGs and commit public funds to private sustainable development goals
- Councilors who oppose the UN Directives will face the Integrity Commissioner who is now bond to the UN Directives.

UNdermines the Role of Council

Council is the governing body... of the municipality, the custodians of its powers.



Councils can only **exercise the powers OF the municipal corporation** in the proper form, either **by bylaw or resolution.**

Those in Public Service have a duty to maintain decision-making options and authority; and protect the resources and public from undue influence.
